ECAC Announces 2009 Division III Metro Men's Soccer All-Stars

CAPE COD, Mass. - The 2009 ECAC Division III Metro men's soccer Offensive Player of the Year earns this title after accumulating 35 points during the 2009 season. Old Westbury senior forward, Fabian Santibanez, tallied 11 goals, 13 assists and one game winning goal this season. This is the second consecutive year that Santibanez has been honored as the Skyline's Player of the Year.

Charlie Cunliffe of Rowan receives the honor of 2009 ECAC Division III Metro Defensive Player of the Year. The junior goalkeeper has helped the team to a 13-6-2 record. Cunliffe had a goals against average of 0.91 and a saves percentage of .866. In the 2009 season, Cunliffe recorded seven shutouts.

The 2009 ECAC Division III Metro Rookie of the Year honor goes to John Dettori from St. Joseph's Long Island. He has recorded 47 points during his first collegiate season. Jansen tallied 19 goals, nine assists, and three gamewinners.

Four forwards are representing the ECAC first All-Star team. Joining Dettori is freshman Rob Santaniello from Ramapo. Santaniello had 38 points this season, netting 16 goals, four of which were gamewinners, and six assists. Senior Michael Cullen of Montclair State posted 27 points for the season. He scored ten goals, including four gamewinners, and had seven assists. Lastly, junior Rafael Duarte from Richard Stockton has 27 points this season, including 12 goals, three assists, and four gamewinners.

Joining the ECAC first All-Star team as a midfielder is junior Stephan Zaech from St. Joseph's Long Island. Zaech has 41 points on the season, recording 14 goals, two gamewinners, and 13 assists. Also, Julian Valerio from Williams Paterson is receiving honors after earning 22 points this season, with eight goals and six assists. Lastly, Montclair State's Joseph Cullen earns ECAC honors after dishing out five assists and scoring five goals to earn 15 points on the season.

St. Joseph's K.J. LaBarbera, York's Jaime Hay, and Montclair State's William Griffin are receiving defensive honors on the ECAC first All-Star team. LaBarbera, a junior, led the Montclair backline, tallying three assists and one goal this season. Hay has been solid in the back, helping the Spartans to a 17-1-5 record. The senior has one goal and one assist. Griffin has had a great impact on Hawks record of 17-2-2, also recording three points on the season. Closing up the defensive unit for ECAC first All-Star team is Cunliffe as the goalkeeper.
